Many thanks to all those who helped make our St. Patricks Fun Day such a success.

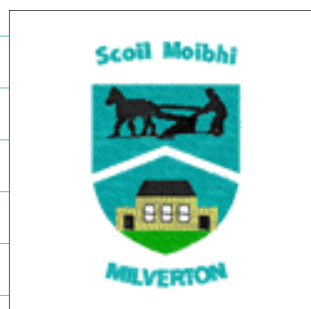
Events like these take lot of organisation and planning and involve many groups of people. A big thank you to the Pupils, Teachers and Parents Association for all their efforts on the day.
